- **Provide routine site status update summaries:** Fact Sheets or other summaries are produced annually or semi-annually and posted on the MCBH environmental restoration site for public review.

Option for Increased Community Involvement

- **Establish a Restoration Advisory Board (RAB):** A RAB is a group of interested local community members who meet with Marine Corps personnel on a routine basis to discuss and provide feedback and advice on environmental cleanup plans and actions

MCBH can not establish and maintain a RAB without sufficient and sustained community interest

Establishing a RAB

What is Sufficient Interest?

VARIETY

Need a variety of people representing diverse interests from the local community

COMMITMENT

Minimum of 10 community members and Maximum of 20 committed to fulfilling RAB Member responsibilities for a term of at least 3 years. There are typically 4 or more meetings per year.



What are RAB Member Responsibilities?

Provide community input to the installation, regulators, and other government agencies on environmental clean-up activities and community involvement by:



- Reviewing and commenting on various technical documents and related site information
- Attending routine RAB meetings and discussing and exchanging information regarding site cleanup
- Serving as a liaison with the community and providing them with information discussed at the RAB meetings
