Homeschooling in Hawaii

Hawaii Board of Education regulations recognize homeschooling as a viable and legitimate alternative for child education. This regulation allows parents to homeschool their children by informing the Department of Education (DOE) with a notice of intent.

All parents choosing to home school their children are required to notify the local public school principal of their intent to homeschool. The following steps are required:

- Submit a completed Form 4140 Exceptions to Compulsory Education
- Submit a written statement of intent to homeschool and include the following:
 - 1. Name, address, and phone number of the child
 - 2. Birth date and grade level of the child
 - 3. Signature of the parent.

This notice of intent acknowledges, as a matter of record, the parent's intent to homeschool and allows the DOE to assist parents in their educational efforts. In addition, families are required to notify the principal if the homeschooling program is terminated or if another educational program is initiated.
