Announcements:

- Marine Corps Base Hawaii is hosting The Beast 10K Run Saturday, March 21, 2015 at Dewey Square. This event is open to the public. This course challenges runners through 10 kilometers that wind throughout the installation with views of Kaneohe Bay and the Nu'upia Ponds. Individual and Formation runners are welcome to endure the hills, pavement and trail terrain. - Nine F/A-18 jet planes are participating in a Sentry Aloha Exercise, a multi-faceted joint exercise that incorporates current, realistic, and integrated training to equip the warfighter with the skill sets necessary to fly, fight and win. The aircraft are visiting from Naval Air Weapons Station China Lake, Calif., and will be on-island through early next week. During the exercise, area residents are likely to see an increase in fighter aircraft take-offs and landings.
