• A series of scheduled a power outages will occur Saturday, March 28, 6:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. and will occur

through May 9, 2015. All buildings and structures east of the Nu'upia Stream, including the Mokapu Gate and East-side Housing, will be without power. The power outages are necessary as the base upgrades the main electrical power service.
