Kristin Wong, Marine Corps Base Hawaii (MARINE CORPS BASE HAWAII) – NOAA, UH explore sunken WWII-era PBY — Beneath the waters of Kaneohe Bay lay a large structure, covered in sea life. Ryan Harismendy, a 26-year-old graduate of the University of Hawaii, described the water as "murky," and the mound like a "giant rock." Harismendy was among students, staff and volunteers with the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration Office of National Marine Sanctuaries and the UH Marine Option Program came aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii June 8 through 19, 2015, to assess the current condition of a sunken aircraft approximately 30 feet underwater off the shore near Hangar 105.
