

Effective 01 February 2023 the New **Ground Safety for Marines** Course requirement:

>> E6 and above only. There are no waivers allowed. **MAXIMUM** class size 20

>>PREREQUISITE: Rank: SSGT, GYSGT, MSGT, WO-1, CWO-2, CWO-3, 2NDLT, 1STLT, CAPT, MAJ, LTCOL; USMC/USN E-6 to E-8 and O-1 to O-5 serving in ground safety billets, or GS Civilians serving in ground safety billets.

>>All personnel must have at least 12 months remaining in job assignment from course completion date.

>>All personnel must complete the Distance Learning (DL) on MarineNet (SDRMGTxxxx):

1. Risk Management modules

- SDRMGTCIV0 – Risk Management for USMC Civilians
- SDRMGTE130 – Risk Management for Private – Lance Corporal
- SDRMGTSEN0 – Risk Management for Senior Leaders
- SDRMGTSUL0 – Risk Management for Small Unit Leaders

2. Marine Corps Records Management Course within 12 months prior to course attendance.

- M01RMT0700 - MC Records Management Course: Every Marine's Responsibility Course

3. Personnel **must provide** completion **certificates** and **appointment letter** *prior* to reporting to class.

**PURPOSE:** Upon completion of Ground Safety for Marines and an approved Ground Mishap Investigation Course, eligible Marine personnel will receive the secondary 8012 MOS, Ground Safety Officer/Specialist.

**SCOPE:** This course provides instruction on basic concepts/techniques for Marine Corps Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) programs, hazard identification and controls, as well as mishap investigation and reporting.

The course includes an introduction to the Marine Corps Safety Program and OSHA; application of OSH General Industry standards (29 CFR 1910); personal protective equipment; hazard recognition and mitigation; risk management; unit safety inspections; mishap investigation fundamentals; and mishap reporting procedures.

**SPECIAL GUIDANCE: REPORTING INSTRUCTIONS:** Students will report to the course location listed in the memorandum. Course start time will be determined by the schoolhouse and provided via separate correspondence. Military students will wear the appropriate camouflage utilities for the season per uniform regulations. Civilian attendees will wear appropriate business casual civilian attire. Guidance for civilian attire for the unit safety inspection will be provided prior to the event. Use of Government billeting and messing is directed if available.
