## Base Access for Qualified Veterans

On your first visit to MCB Hawaii, visit the Visitors Center, building 1637, MCB Hawaii, or the Pass and Registration Office, Camp Smith, and present your Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC). The VHIC must identify your eligibility status as Service-Connected, Medal of Honor, Purple Heart, Former POW, or a combination thereof.

Provide a second form of government identification that verifies your social security number (Social Security Card, Taxpayer Identification Number, or Certificate of Naturalization).

The clerk will register your VHIC card in the Defense Biometric Identification System (DBIDS) and ask you to provide required biographical information. This process can take 5 - 10 minutes and when completed, you are successfully registered for Base access.

Please present your VHIC to the gate sentry each time you visit the Base, where it will be scanned to verify your Base access eligibility.

## Base Access for Primary Caregivers

On the first visit to MCB Hawaii, visit the Visitors Center, building 1637, MCB Hawaii, or the Pass and Registration Office, Camp Smith, and present your Official Caregiver Letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers that lists you as the Primary Caregiver.

Provide your REAL-ID compliant driver's license and a second form of government identification that verifies your social security number (Social Security Card, Taxpayer Identification Number, or Certificate of Naturalization).

The clerk will register your REAL-ID driver's license in the Defense Biometric Identification System (DBIDS) and ask you to provide required biographical information. This process can take 5 - 10 minutes and when completed, you are successfully registered for Base access.

Caregivers without a REAL-ID compliant driver's license will be issued a DBIDS credential for Base access.

Please present your REAL-ID driver's license or your DBIDS credential to the gate sentry each time you visit the Base, where it will be scanned to verify your Base access eligibility.

## MCB Hawaii Policies & Regulations

All existing policies, orders, directives, and processes issued under the command of Marine Corps Base Hawaii remains in effect until changed, cancelled, revised, or superseded by new policy, order, or directive. Please ensure you are familiar with these policies as they are applicable to all personnel aboard the installation. Here are a few that will directly apply to you and your visit to MCB Hawaii.

All personnel aboard MCB Hawaii are required to obey the following airfield/runway movement instructions while operating a vehicle or on foot. Use only the Mokapu Road crossing and obey all posted signs, road gates, and instructions from airfield personnel. Pedestrians and joggers are prohibited from crossing the runway. Failure to comply may result in loss of base access.

MCBHO 1020.7 establishes the requirements for dress or wearing of clothing by civilians. It sets personal appearance standards for civilians in public areas aboard MCBH.
