Target Audience: Mandatory DoD training -- Unit Environmental Compliance Coordinators (ECC), Hazardous Waste Shop Level Coordinators (SLC), and their alternates. Or complete the equivalent Army course which fulfills the same requirement (per MCO 5090): "Defense Hazardous Material/Waste Handling" (9E-F50/322-F34). Note: Not equivalent per COMNAVAIRFORINST 4790.

Course Description

This 24 hour course provides information needed by personnel who generate hazardous waste to perform their duties safely and in compliance with legal and Navy policy standards. The RCRA regulation 40 CFR 262 establishes standards for HW generators. This course meets the initial training requirements of 'The Naval Aviation Maintenance Program (NAMP)'COMNAVAIRFORINST 4790.2B change 1 section 10.19.3.3 and 10.19.3.4. Generators who accumulate waste for less than 90 days must prepare and implement a training program which complies with the standards in 40 CFR 265.16 which mandates that personnel must be trained to perform their duties in a way that ensures compliance. HMTA 49 CFR 172.704(a)(1) and 172.704(a)(3) require training in hazardous material recognition and identification; and safety for each HAZMAT employee. HAZWOPER regulations, 29 CFR 1910.120(q)(6)(i) requires personnel who are likely to witness a release of hazardous substances to be trained to an awareness level. In California, this course covers - Title 22.

Eligible Personnel

Personnel (military or civilian) who generate, package, handle, store, transport, or manage hazardous materials or waste in the performance of their duties.

Purpose: This course provides personnel with the knowledge and skills necessary to respond safely and effectively to releases of, or substantial threats of releases of, hazardous substances, in compliance with applicable federal, state, and USN environmental regulations and instructions.

Scope: This course fulfills the training requirements established by regulations delineated in 29 CFR 1910.120(q) Emergency response to hazardous substance releases, and 29 CFR 1910.120(p)(7)(i) Operations conducted at a transfer, storage and disposal (TSD) facility. The appropriate installation representative or their designee will provide TSD site- specific training. This also fulfills the training requirements in OPNAVINST 5090.1(series), and OPNAVINST 5100.23(series).

Prerequisites: Civilian and military personnel ashore who may serve as activity Emergency Response personnel, as well as the following: Fire and Police Department personnel; Environmental Engineers, Specialists, and Technicians; Environmental Managers and Supervisors; SOH personnel; Waste Handlers and TSD facility personnel; Hazardous Materials Minimization Center (HAZMINCEN) personnel; Warehousemen and Laboratory personnel. Shipboard personnel will be granted quotas, space available, upon verification of membership on the shipboard spill response team. All personnel must have at least 12 months from course date remaining in job assignment.

This also fulfills the training requirements of OPNAVINST 5090.1(series) and OPNAVINST 5100.23(series).

Prerequisites: Civilian and military personnel who have previously met the training requirements of HAZWOPER regulations delineated in 29 CFR 1910.120(q), and 29 CFR 1910.120(p)(7)(i), and are required to receive refresher training to maintain their competencies.

Personnel Eligible

Due to the limited number of seats approved by NAVFAC and HQ USMC, CECOS is only able to accommodate quota requests for the 8-Hr Refresher ONLINE course from individuals who work directly in support of Navy/Marine Corps Environmental Cleanup/Restoration programs. The NEPA Application Course, presented in a three-day seminar, provides participants with the legal requirements, Navy policy, procedures and techniques for implementing NEPA, and is the foundation for more advanced NEPA coursework. This course focuses on: selecting the proper document; levels of analysis; public involvement; review process; and impact analysis required under the law. Lectures, case studies and hands-on workshops involving Navy-scenarios are part of this in-depth study of NEPA analysis process. The course focuses on documentation and sufficiency requirements for the Categorical Exclusion and Environmental Assessment. The course is taught by an experienced planning practitioner with additional legal support by the Department of the Navy, Office of the General Counsel.

Hazardous Waste Annual Refresher is an 8-hour course that provides hazardous waste workers with updated regulatory and technical information needed to perform their duties safely and in compliance with legal and Navy policy requirements. RCRA regulation 40 CFR 264.16(c) and 265.16(c) requires annual review of initial hazardous waste training. Per 40 CFR 262.34(a)(4), generators of HW who accumulate waste for less than 90 days must prepare and implement a training program which complies with the standards in 40 CFR 265.16 which mandates personnel training. HAZWOPER 29 CFR 1910.120(q)(8) requires annual refresher training in emergency spill response. This course meets the annual training requirements of 'The Naval Aviation Maintenance Program (NAMP) 'COMNAVAIRFORINST 4790.2B change 1 section 10.19.3.3 and 10.19.3.4.

Eligible Personnel

Personnel who have completed Hazardous Waste Facility Operators course or the Hazardous Waste Generators/Handlers course and require annual update.

Prerequisites: Personnel must be in GS-0018 (Safety and Occupational Health Management), GS-0019 (Safety Technician), GS-0640 (Health Aid and Technician/IH Tech), GS-0690 (Industrial Hygiene), GS-0803 (Safety Engineering) classification series, Industrial Hygiene Officers, or military personnel who may serve in full time or collateral duty safety/hazardous material duties, as well as those civilian or military personnel involved in the management of Hazardous Material Minimization Center (HAZMINCEN) operations.
