1. Marine Corps Base Hawaii (MCBH) conducted Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) sampling and analysis of the Kaneohe Bay Public Water System (PWS No. 356) on 12 December 2023 in accordance with ref. (a). PFAS, including all twenty-five (25) analytes from EPA Method 533, and eighteen (18) analytes from EPA Method 537.1, were not found in concentrations above laboratory detection limits. MCBH drinking water meets all Federal and State standards and is safe to drink. Laboratory data sheets are included as Enclosure 1.

2. MCBH receives potable water from the Honolulu Board of Water Supply (BWS) which is responsible for monitoring primary regulated constituents and a rotating list of secondary, unregulated constituents. The MCBH Leeward properties including Manana Housing, Camp H. M. Smith, Pu'uloa Rifle Training Facility, and Pearl City Annex served by the Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam (JBPHH) water system.

3. Additional information regarding MCBH drinking water quality, source information, and sampling data is provided in Annual Drinking Water Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), typically published in June.
