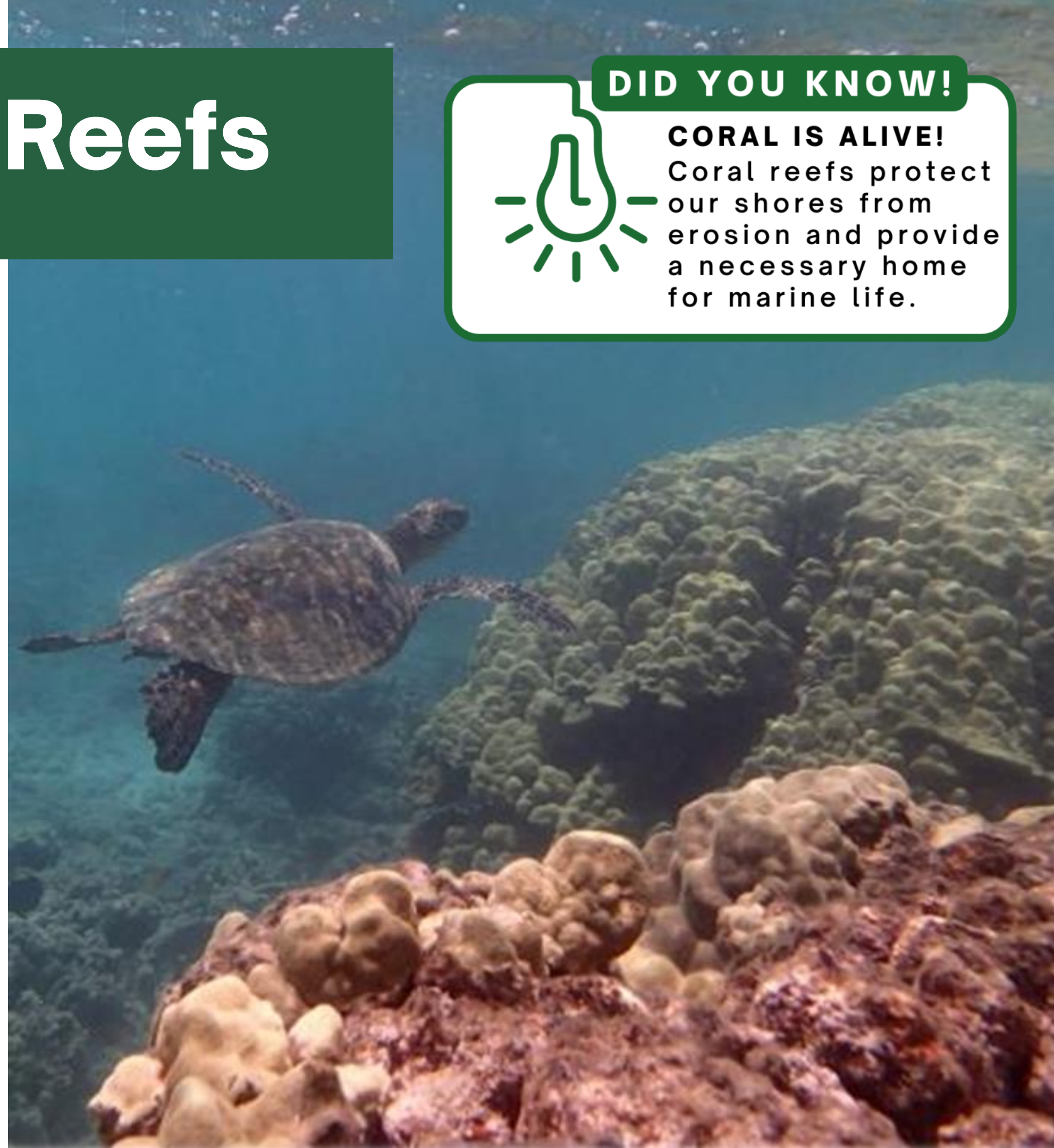
Protect Our Coral Reefs

- ❑ Stand or walk **ONLY** in sandy areas
- ❑ Canoe, kayak, and SUP – min 2 ft of water
- ❑ Never drag canoes, kayaks, SUPs, dive flags, or gear over the reef.
- ❑ Anchor watercrafts only in sandy areas
- ❑ Don't remove any coral, shells or rocks.
It's against state law!
- ❑ Use Coral Safe sunscreen!
- ❑ TRASH – ***Pack it in, Pack it out*** wherever you go.

DID YOU KNOW!



CORAL IS ALIVE!
Coral reefs protect our shores from erosion and provide a necessary home for marine life.



Hawaiian Green Sea Turtles

Protected by Federal law:
Endangered Species Act

- Seen resting on our beaches year-round.
- **Nesting season:** April- September
 - Nests on all beaches.
- Use **Barbless** fishing hooks

Hawaiian Monk Seals

Protected by Federal law:
Marine Mammal Protection Act
Endangered Species Act

- Less than **1400** left in the world often seen resting on MCBH beaches.
- Disturbing seals is a federal offense. Disturbance **could lose training privileges.**
- Monk seals are threatened by fishery interactions, human-caused trauma and **toxoplasmosis.**

No Dogs on MCBH beaches from 1000 - 1500.
Pets must remain on leash at all times!



Rule of Thumb!
Bystanders must remain behind markers or at least **50 ft** away.

Sea Bird Fallout

- **Turn off outdoor lights when not in use!**
- **Find a Shearwater or injured bird?:**
 - Contact base Environmental at (808) 257-7000 or (808) 285-6464
 - **Working hours:** seabird will be picked up
 - **After Hours:** Contact PMO

If the seabird is in a safe location and will be picked up soon, leave it be.

If after hours or the seabird is at risk of predators or cars secure in a cardboard box or the **BLUE** box provided by Environmental.



**Shearwater Fall Out
November-December**

Migratory Bird Treaty Act Protected Species

MCBH houses a nesting colony of Wedge-tailed Shearwaters.

Juvenile Wedge-tailed Shearwaters are just learning to fly, and often get disorientated by bright city lights and fly inland instead of toward the sea.

Due to exhaustion they fall to the ground and get injured. Many are unable to take flight again and become vulnerable to predators.

Mammalian Predators

Feral Cats are a direct threat to ecosystems through disease and predation.

Toxoplasmosis is the leading disease threat to Hawaiian monk seals; caused by a parasite that can only reproduce in the gut of cats.

- All pets must be microchipped, registered with the on base animal control officers.
- All pets must be on a leash under their owners physical control when outside

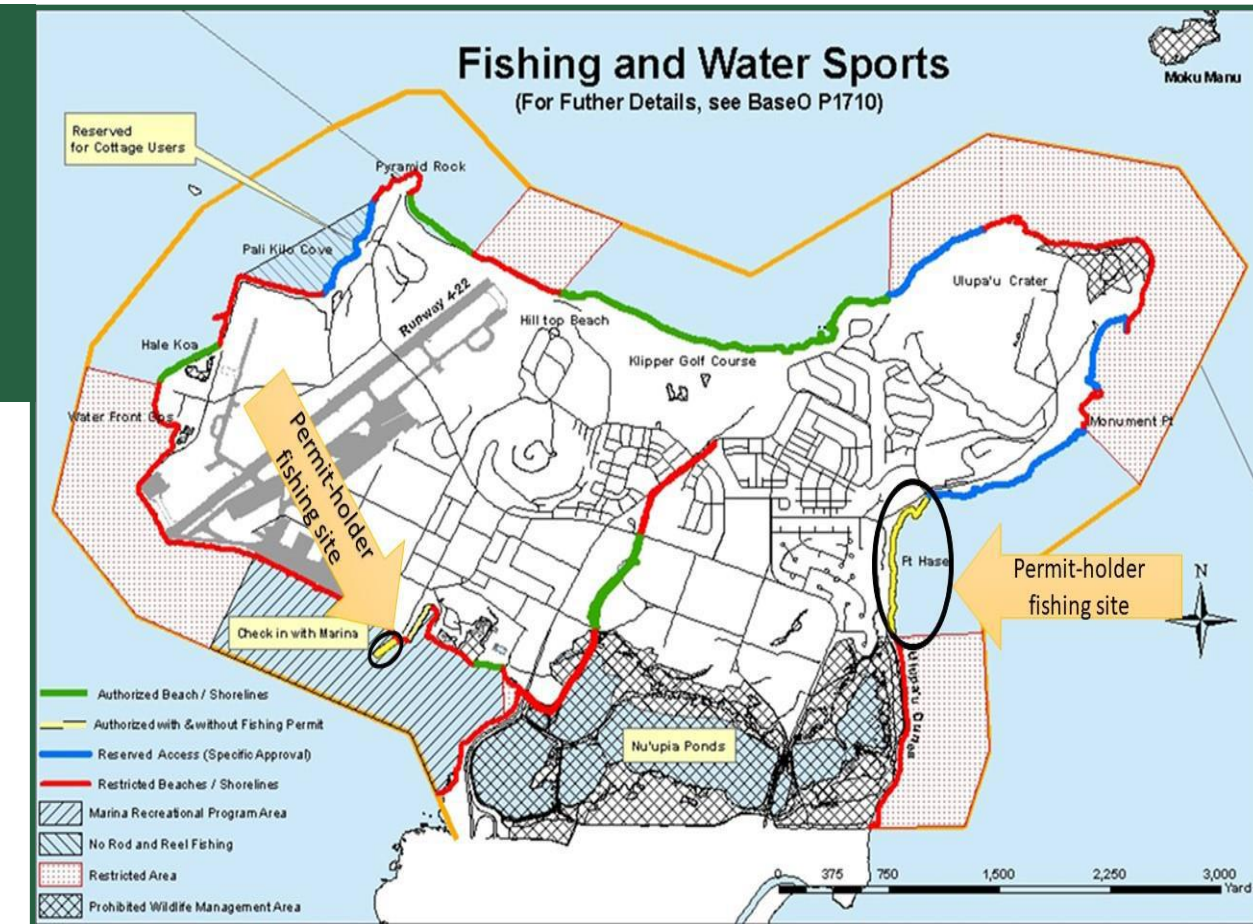

Fishing & Recreation

In addition to state and federal laws, MCBH has its own Prohibitions & Restrictions!

- For questions regarding the MCBH fishing regulations grab the fishing regulations booklet from the base environmental booth during break, or contact Base Environmental 257-7000 / 257-7129



The following are excerpts of regulations & restrictions.

Gear Restrictions:

ONLY Barbless Circle Hooks may be used when fishing! Crimping down the barb on hooks is permissible.

Only 2 poles allowed for every person actively fishing.

Attend to your fishing gear at all times.

PROHIBITED to use gill nets, lay nets, or cross nets. Throw nets must have a minimum stretched mesh size of more than two inches.

Spear guns must be registered with MPD (base security and access control order)

Prohibitions:

If you Cannot Identify the Species- Catch & Release ONLY!

No Rod & Reel Fishing at Pali Kilo Cove

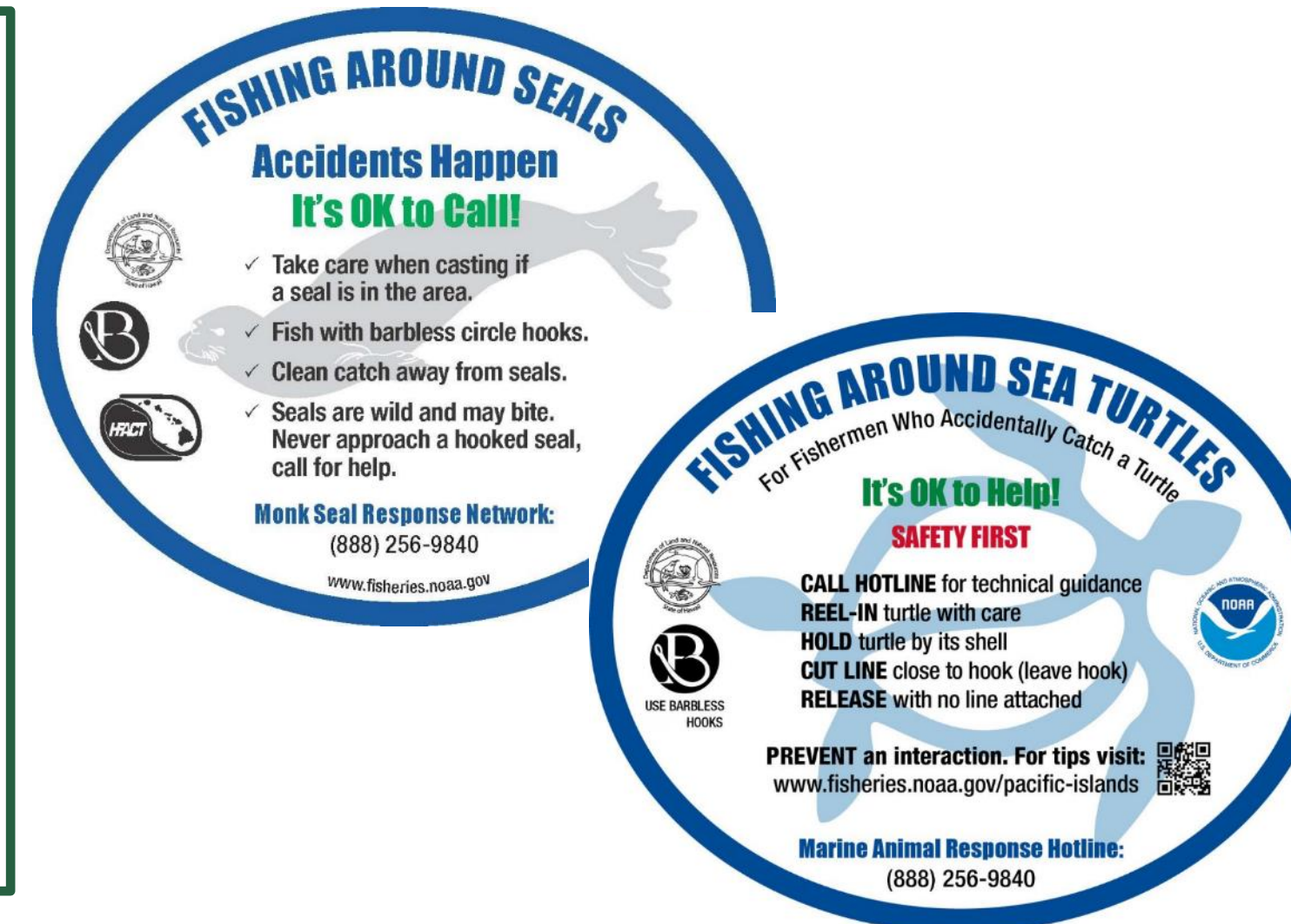
No Chumming or Dumping Food Scraps in the Water to Lure Fish anywhere on MCBH

No Collection of Seahorses

No Collection of Marine Animals for Personal Use

No Wana (Sea Urchin), Ula (spiny lobster), Ula papa (slipper lobster) or 'Opihi (Limpet) Picking

Crabbing is prohibited in the Mōkapu Central Drainage Channel (MCDC) or the Nu'upia Ponds Wildlife Management Area



BARBLESS HOOKS!



CRIMP IT!: Base Regulation states ONLY Barbless Fishing Hooks shall be used on MCBH.

**Crimp the hook's barb.

Why Barbless? *It's the hook's basic design that makes it effective—not the barb*

- Safer for our fish, endangered monk seals, & threatened sea turtles

Protect Our Shores & Cultural Sites

- MCBH Kaneohe Bay shoreline designated as Mōkapu Burial Area
- Native Hawaiian culturally sensitive
 - Protected under federal & state law
- No Digging or Taking Sand or Rocks from Beaches
 - Strictly Prohibited
- Recreational off-roading
 - Prohibited on public beaches or government land

Loss of vegetation = loss of shoreline & habitat!



Keep MCBH & Our Ocean Clean



To report a Spill Contact

■ All storm drains lead to the ocean!

- Avoid washing vehicle at home
- Vehicle maintenance is NOT authorized in any parking area on MCBH
- Bag all trash and store in lidded bins
- Pick up after your pets
- Rake yard clippings and put in green bin

■ Sanitary Sewer System

- Only toilet paper in the toilet!
- No Wipes!
- Throw fat, oils, and grease in the trash



6 Steps to clean up a Spill

1 SAFETY First

Let some one in command know whats happened. You are going to need HELP
Identify the Physical and Chemical Hazards: use the SDS (Safety Data Sheet)
Use the Proper (Level D) PPE Gloves, Eye Protection and Splash Guard (appron)

2 NOTIFY Environmental and the proper Authorties

Let your supervisor or ECC know
Your Supervisor or the ECC may call Emergeny Dispatch Fed Fire (**Military 911**)
IMMEDIATELY Call Base ENVIRONMENTAL
Base Environmental will notify the USCG the STATE OF HAWAII and LEPC
If One Drop gets in the water or 25 gals or more spills on land

3 CONTROL the Source

Close Valves, Close Switches, Turn Off the Power, Right the Container, Plug the Hole

4 CONTAIN the Spilled Material

Use sorbent socks and oil dry to contain the spill and keep it from spreading
Use sorbent socks, oil dry or oil sponge to protect the drains
Use oil boom for containment if it gets into the water

5 CLEAN-UP the Spilled Material

Use sorbent material (pads or pillows) to soak up the product
Use non sparking shovels or brooms and dust pans to pick up the oil dry

6 DISPOSE (properly) of the Cleanup Materials

Put the sorbent material into clear 6 mil plastic bags.
Use clear bags so Hazwaste can see what's in them (no liquids in the bag)
Shedule for HAZWASTE for pick up sorbents and liquids
