

# MCB Hawaii will transition to the Defense Biometrics Identification System (DBIDS) on 01 September 2018

On September 1, 2018, MCB Hawaii will transition to a new government-owned access control system called Defense Biometric Identification System (DBIDS). DBIDS is a DoD identity authentication and force protection tool that is fully operational in military locations around the world. Utilizing a combination of biometric and smartcard-based cryptographic authentication, DBIDS prevents unauthorized access attempts while also identifying personnel with law enforcement alerts. DBIDS is replacing RAPIDGate and MCB Hawaii Contractor credentials for contractors/vendors/service providers and other non-DoD affiliated personnel requiring unescorted installation access. There is no cost for a DBIDS credential.

Personnel with a Common Access Card or a variation of the Uniformed Services Identification Card are automatically enrolled in DBIDS after their first ID scan by the gate sentry upon entering MCB Hawaii, Camp H. M. Smith, or Pu'uloa Rifle Range Complex.

Effective 01 September 2018, until further notice, PMO will conduct 100% identification checks of all personnel entering MCB Hawaii, Camp H. M. Smith, and Pu'uloa Rifle Range Complex. Personnel will present their CAC or Uniformed Services Identification Card to the gate sentry for DBIDS enrollment. Expect a 3-6 second delay per ID card scan for enrollment. Passengers are requested to have their ID card available before approaching the gate.

## THE FOLLOWING BASE ACCESS PROCEDURES ARE EFFECTIVE ON 10 SEPTEMBER 2018

-All contractors, vendors, and service providers with a valid RAPIDGate credential or a MCB Hawaii Contractor credential or contractor temporary pass are required to pre-enroll in DBIDS and exchange their credential for a DBIDS credential or paper pass by 10 December 2018.

-All long-term visitors with a MCB Hawaii Visitor credential or a long-term visitor temporary pass are required to pre-enroll in DBIDS and exchange their credential for a DBIDS credential or a DBIDS paper pass by 10 December 2018.

-Personnel who fail to exchange their credentials by 10 December 2018, will be directed to the nearest DBIDS location for credential exchange. Expect significant delays at DBIDS issue locations.

-New contractors, vendors, and service providers will pre-enroll in DBIDS not more than 30 days and not less than five days before the visit and will be issued a DBIDS credential or a DBIDS temporary paper pass. Contact your Base Sponsor for additional information.

-All unescorted personal visitors entering MCB Hawaii, Camp H. M. Smith, and Pu'uloa Rifle Range Complex will pre-enroll in DBIDS and will be issued an appropriate DBIDS credential or paper pass at no cost.

#### Frequently Asked Questions

+Can I continue to pay for a RAPIDGate credential instead of enrolling in DBIDS?

-No. The Marine Corps' contract with RAPIDGate expires on 01 October 2018.

+Can I sponsor a Foreign National as an unescorted personal visitor in DBIDS?

- No. Foreign National personal visitors are not authorized unescorted base access. Please refer to Base Order 5532 w/Ch 5 for procedures to sponsor Foreign National personal visitors.

+ I am a non-DoD federal employee with a PIV credential and work aboard MCB Hawaii. Am I required to obtain a DBIDS credential?

-No. However, you must come to the Visitors Center, B1637, the PMO Customer Service Center, B1095, MCB Hawaii, or the Pass and Registration Office, B601, Camp H. M. Smith, for DBIDS enrollment. Your PIV credential will then be scanned at the gate the same as a CAC or DBIDS credential.

+Are criminal history checks completed on unescorted visitors and contractors?

-Yes. All unescorted non-military affiliated personnel entering MCB Hawaii will have a criminal history inquiry through the National Crime Information Center Interstate Identification Index (NCIC III), the State of Hawaii Judiciary Information Management System, and the Consolidated Law Enforcement Operations Center.

+What type of criminal history will disqualify a person from entering MCB Hawaii?

-Any felony conviction within the last ten years and certain felony convictions more than 10 years old, any person on probation or parole, and outstanding criminal and non-criminal warrants are the most common disqualifiers. Refer to Base Order 5532 w/Ch5 for a complete list of disqualifiers.

+Why are contractors and unescorted visitors required to pre-enroll in DBIDS?

-Pre-enrollment expedites the enrollment process at the Visitors Center to reduce wait times and facilitates the criminal background check before the contractor/visitor arrives at the Visitors Center.

+I am bringing some of my civilian friends on base in my vehicle. Are they required to pre-enroll in DBIDS and get a DBIDS temporary pass?

-No, they are considered escorted visitors.

+I am sponsoring my visitors in person at the Visitors Center but they want to drive their own vehicle on base. Are they required to pre-enroll in DBIDS?

-No. They are considered escorted visitors and they will receive a DBIDS temporary paper pass. Pre-enrollment is highly encouraged as it will expedite the pass issue process.

+Do my unescorted visitors have to pre-enroll in DBIDS each time they visit the base?

-No. Once your visitors are enrolled in DBIDS after their first visit, all you need to do is submit the Base Access Request Form (MCBH S-7 Form 5532) prior to each visit.
