1. Situation. Currently there are no established regulations governing hunting feral pigs on MCB Hawaii.

2. Cancellation. BaseO P1710.1 Paragraph 1001.c.

3. Mission. Establish a recreational hunting program aboard MCB Hawaii.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent. Manage and operate a recreational hunting program at MCTAB.

b. Concept of Operations. Hunting will be conducted in compliance with the references and all other applicable Federal, State, and County laws and regulations.

5. Administration and Logistics

a. The requirements contained in this order may be waived as the Commanding Officer deems necessary and appropriate. Any recommended changes shall be submitted to the Operations and Training (O&T) Directorate.

b. MCB Hawaii O&T Directorate is charged with administrating this Order and will take the initiative to request assistance and work effectively and harmoniously with the Environmental Compliance and Protection Department which is charged with managing the fish and wildlife programs aboard MCB Hawaii. Bulletins announcing regulatory changes or clarifications may be published periodically.

c. Punitive Effect. Military, retired military, dependents, and

civilians who violate this Order, Federal or State hunting regulations may be prosecuted under Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice or referred to the Special Assistant U.S. Attorney for prosecution as appropriate, in addition to any administrative action taken regarding hunting privileges.

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This order is applicable to all hunting participants aboard MCB Hawaii.

b. Signal. This order is effective the date signed.

CHAPTER 1

DEFINITIONS

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CHAPTER 1

DEFINITIONS

1001. CATEGORY OF AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL

1. Military personnel. Active duty, retired, and reservists regardless of duty status.
2. Civilian employee. Civil Service and Non-appropriated Fund employees assigned to or employed on MCB Hawaii including Civil Service and Non-appropriated Fund employees who retire from these installations. This does not include contractors working on these installations.
3. Civilian. Non-military or non-contracted employees and dependents.
4. Uniformed Services. Members of the Coast Guard, Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service, and the organization in question, active duty members of the Commissioned Corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

1002. ANIMAL CLASSIFICATION

1. Game. Animal that is hunted. Wild pigs are the only authorized game aboard MCB Hawaii.
2. Threatened and endangered species. Plant or animal species protected by the Endangered Species Act. See the MCB Hawaii Integrated Natural Resource Management Plan for current list of threatened and endangered species aboard MCB Hawaii

1003. PRIVILEGES CATEGORY

1. Hunter. A certified person in good standing with MCB Hawaii who possesses a state of Hawaii hunting liscence and has the prerequisite requirements to take game on MCB Hawaii.
2. Suspension. Loss of privilege for a time determined by Base Order or Magistrate Hearings Officer, after which privilege is automatically reinstated.
3. Revocation. Permanent loss of privileges.

1004. HUNTING TERMS

1. Possession. Control of articles, property, or wildlife without regard to ownership.
2. Bait. Natural or processed food products or flavorings used to lure and/or entice wildlife. Bait includes but is not limited to sugar, honey, syrups, oils, salts, spices, peanut butter, grease, meat, bones, blood, fruits, nuts or grains and extracts of such products.
3. Archery Equipment. Long bows, recurved bows, compound bows, and associated accessories authorized for use by State regulation.

4. Organized Hunting. The practice of hunting feral pigs in an organized group.

5. Sportsmen. Person(s) permitted to or engaged in hunting pigs as authorized by this Order.

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CHAPTER 2

HUNTING REGULATIONS

2001. SAFETY

1. All hunters are strictly accountable for observing all reasonable and necessary safety precautions. In the use of bow and arrow, all persons hunting will be familiar with the handling and function of the bow they are using. Safety will be considered at all times while hunting. When objects unintended to be shot are hit, it is prima facie (based on what is known or seen when something is first considered or dealt with) evidence of a negligent discharge. Shooting at signs, into water, at solid objects, trees, structures, or vehicles is prima facie evidence of a careless act.
2. It is mandatory that anyone hunting from an elevated position (tree stand) utilize a safety harness.
3. A bow with a nocked arrow is considered loaded, and should not be pointed in the direction of another individual or above the immediate horizon.
4. No shooting across roads or within areas designated as no-shoot zones.

2002. AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL. The following persons are authorized to conduct activities identified in this Order and to sponsor guests:

1. Military personnel (i.e., active duty, retired, and reservists regardless of duty status).
2. Civilian employees of MCB Hawaii, active or retired.
3. Other Uniformed Services. Members of the Coast Guard, Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service, and the organization in question, active duty members of the Commissioned Corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.
4. Sponsored Civilians. All civilians, when sponsored and accompanied by permitted personnel. Sponsors of such persons are responsible for their conduct, safety, and supervision while conducting activities on Base and must remain in the same hunting area. Guests must be with sponsors at all times. Sponsors are accountable for verifying that each person sponsored has been issued a current Hawaii hunting license and Base hunting permit prior to check in. A sponsor may take no more than two guests on an individual hunt. When sponsored or dependent persons have their licenses suspended or revoked, the sponsors' licenses can be similarly suspended or revoked when negligent, unsupervised, contributory, instructional, or other culpable action by the sponsor can be shown.

2003. LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

1. All persons authorized to hunt will have in their possession a proper and valid State of Hawaii hunting license, Base hunting permit, and valid personal identification.

a. Base permit applicants must first satisfy Hawaii licensing requirements prior to issuance of a Base hunting permit. State Licenses may be obtained online or in person at the Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Forestry and Wildlife, 1151 Punchbowl Street, Room 325, Honolulu, HI 96813.

b. All applicants for Base hunting permits must successfully pass the written and shooting proficiency exams administered by O&T.

c. The MCB Hawaii hunting permit will be valid for three years with a valid State hunting license.

c. All persons 13 years of age and over must apply for a Base hunting permit. Persons 13 through 15 years of age will be allowed to hunt when under immediate control and adjacent to their licensed parent or guardian.

d. Persons under 13 years of age will not be allowed to hunt but may accompany their parents or guardians provided parents or guardians have signed the waiver of liability. See enclosure 3.

2. Hunters are required to keep application data and profile current throughout the license period.

2004. CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORIZATION. The Director, O&T or his/her designated appointee will determine and/or accomplish the following tasks prior to issuing permits:

1. Applicant is eligible and possesses appropriate licenses and identification prescribed in this Order.

2. All civilians, including dependents and civilians sponsored by military or uniformed services personnel, sign the waiver of liability releasing the government from all responsibility in case of accident or injury while conducting activities covered by this Order. The certificate will be retained on file by the Base Conservation Law Enforcement Officer (CLEO).

3. All applicants are familiar with current Federal, State, County, and Base hunting, laws and regulations, and applicable fire danger classifications, unsafe areas, etc.

2005. COMMANDING OFFICER'S DISABLED SPORTSMAN PROGRAM

1. The Director, O&T, assisted by the Base CLEO, may periodically schedule organized hunts to facilitate access for disabled hunters.

2. Scheduling of these hunts will be the responsibility of the O&T Directorate in coordination with the Base CLEO.

2006. AREA AVAILABILITY. Available hunting areas will be assigned per existing training requirements. Hunting areas will not be active if any training is being conducted aboard MCTAB. Coordination of available areas will be as follows:

a. The Base Range Control Officer will provide the Base CLEO a copy of the MCTAB training area availability.

b. Each month, the Base CLEO will receive from the Range Control Scheduling Office the Hunting Notice "Hot Sheet," which designates the training areas available. Changes will not be made to available training areas by the Range Control Officer after the Hot Sheet has been issued to the CLEO unless there are unforeseen extraordinary training requirements.

c. The Base CLEO, in coordination with other Environmental Compliance and Protection Department staff, is responsible for determining the number of hunters allowed in available areas.

2007. HUNTING AREAS

1. MCTAB is the only authorized hunting location aboard MCB Hawaii. See enclosure (1).

2. The Commanding Officer, MCB Hawaii may designate new hunting areas or change hunting area boundaries by approving a new hunting area map. Changes will become effective when the map is published.

3. Restrictions to Hunting Access

a. Hunters are authorized to drive privately owned vehicles (POVs) into MCTAB but must park in designated parking areas as indicated on the map and park in a manner that does not impede law enforcement and emergency vehicles. Hunters may take their vehicle to the closest point on a road to the kill in order to load it into the vehicle. No off-road travel is authorized. Hunters are not authorized to drive past any road barricades.

b. Hunters may access locked gates when the area is open for hunting provided that a gate key has been obtained from range control. See enclosure (2).

c. When an area is reserved for an organized hunt, only members of the organized hunts will be permitted to hunt within the assigned area. No other person or unit personnel will enter the area.

d. Hunting parties are restricted to three hunters per party.

e. Access is restricted to designated Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays from one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset.

f. No hunting in wetlands, streams, the cemetery, or areas identified as training area buffer zones (MOUT).

2008. CHECK-IN, CHECK-OUT, AND HARVEST REPORTING

1. General

a. Each person is responsible for obtaining clearance (check-in) from the range control prior to going into the field. Check-in refers to going to range control to obtain clearance to enter the hunting area. Check-out

refers to going to range control to exit. All persons allowed clearance to hunting areas are required to adhere to all hunting and safety regulations.

b. Range Control will provide training on check-in, check-out, and harvest reporting via hard copy report cards.

2. Check-In and Check-Out Procedures

a. All hunters shall check-in and check-out with MCB Hawaii Range Control via hard copy forms.

b. The area clearance pass obtained from check-in at range control must be displayed on the vehicle's dashboard while participating in activities identified in this Order. The pass must be returned to range control immediately upon leaving the field.

c. Failure to check out within one hour after legal shooting time on the day for which the pass was issued will result in the suspension of hunter privileges unless they have called in and reported they will be late.

3. Harvest Reporting

a. All individual hunters that harvest game must report harvest to range control.

b. All individual hunters must fill out a hunting report card and turn in to range control upon check out, whether or not they have harvested a pig.

2009. GENERAL

1. Archery hunting will be per reference (a) and the provisions of this Order.

2. Hunting, killing, taking, possessing, transporting, trapping, or harassing of any animal other than wild pig is strictly prohibited.

3. Importing any animal species to the Base for the purpose of release is prohibited.

4. All edible portions of harvested game must be kept in an edible condition.

5. Baiting areas to draw in pigs is prohibited.

6. Entrails must be in wooded areas and out of site of traveled paths.

2010. BAG LIMITS. Bag limits for feral pigs at MCTAB will be one per hunter, per day.

2011. EQUIPMENT REGULATIONS

1. Archery hunting is the only authorized form of hunting at MCTAB.

a. It is unlawful to possess a loaded firearm in MCTAB, with the exception of law enforcement and nuisance animal control officials.

b. Hunting with dogs is not authorized.

2. Archery Equipment

a. Poisonous, drugged, explosive, or barbed arrows are prohibited. A barbed arrow within the meaning of this Order is one with points or barbs that protrude backwards from the head or point of the arrow in such a way that they may hook or keep the arrow from being pulled through the point of penetration only by tearing the flesh of the animal.

b. Crossbows are not authorized.

c. Allowable archery equipment:

(1) Minimum broadhead width and the rated pull of bows will be per reference (a). Mechanical broadheads are permitted per reference (a). Only arrows having a minimum blade cutting diameter width of three quarters of an inch are permitted.

(2) Long bows must have a minimum of forty pounds of drawing tension at a twenty-eight inch draw.

(3) Recurved bows must have a minimum of thirty-five pounds of drawing tension.

(4) Compound bows must have a minimum of thirty pounds of drawing tension.

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CHAPTER 3

ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS

3001. GENERAL

1. The Commanding Officer, MCB Hawaii maintains the policy to use all legal means available to reduce violations of regulations identified or referenced in this Order. Violators will be educated and held accountable, as appropriate, by the most effective means available.
2. The Base CLEO will provide guidance and assistance to O&T.

3002. RESPONSIBILITY

1. All hunters will comply with these regulations while conducting activities identified within this Order aboard MCTAB.
2. The Base CLEO will supervise and coordinate enforcement of all statutes, rules and regulations identified or referenced in this Order to include safe hunting practices at MCTAB.
3. Hunters who witness or have reason to believe a regulatory violation identified or referenced in this Order has occurred or is about to occur will report violators or incidents. Violations should be reported to the Base CLEO at telephone 216-5178 or 479-7361, or to range control at telephone 257-3180. All reports should include as much descriptive information as possible.

3003. CONSERVATION LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

1. The CLEO are the law enforcement agents through whom the Commanding Officer, MCB Hawaii empowers with enforcing and assuring compliance with all Federal & State laws, rules and regulations associated with natural and cultural resources as well as public safety. In the event a criminal act is suspected the CLEO will investigate. The Base CLEO may detain, make arrests, issue citations, apprehend, gather evidence, and stop vehicles on board MCTAB based on a reasonable belief that a violation has been committed. The Base CLEO shall also enforce all regulations covered within the Marine Corps/Department of Interior Fish and Wildlife Service Memorandum of Agreement (USMC/DOI USFWS MOA) under NAVMC DIR 5090.4A.
2. All individuals not in compliance are subject to arrest, issuing of citations and / or termination of all hunting and access privileges aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii facilities and installations.
3. The Base CLEOs will conform to the standards and procedures set forth in reference (a), (c), (d), and (e) with the use of force.
4. The Provost Marshal's Office will assist the Base CLEO in the performance of his/her duties when requested.

3004. SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF PRIVILEGES. No person will conduct activities identified or referenced in this Order within jurisdiction of MCB

Hawaii, MCAS, and MCTAB anytime their sportsman's privileges have been suspended or revoked pursuant to the provisions of this Order.

3005. REPORTING HUNTING ACCIDENTS

1. Any hunter or other person, military or civilian, having knowledge that a hunting accident has occurred will immediately attempt to get medical assistance by calling 911. The caller will indicate that a medical emergency exists and will provide their name, the name of the injured party, the exact location of the injured person(s), the nature of the accident or injury, and the time the accident occurred.

2. The person requesting medical assistance will then immediately contact Range Control at (808) 257-3180 or 257-2067 to report the accident and provide all pertinent information.

3. When notified of a hunting accident that occurs on MCTAB, Range Control will immediately inform the Base CLEO and Military Police Department (MPD) that a hunting accident has occurred and will take appropriate action to secure the scene, persons, and physical evidence pertinent to the investigation. Primary investigative jurisdiction will be assumed by Base CLEO. Immediate notification will be given to Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) and the Provost Marshal's Office (PMO), Criminal Investigative Division (CID). Base CLEO will keep the Director, Installation, Environmental & Logistics; and Director, O&T informed on the investigation.

4. The Base CLEO will submit a written report to the ECPD Director. The Director ECPD will coordinate this information with the Director O&T and MPD.

5. Upon notification of an injury, the Director O&T will recommend an investigation as per reference (d) if the situation warrants.

6. When a hunting accident results in death or when injury is such that death could result, the Director IE&L, or his designee will immediately notify the NCIS Command on MCB Hawaii, who will investigate the circumstances of the accident.

3006. SEARCH OF MOTOR VEHICLES

1. When there is reason to believe that regulations identified or referenced in this Order were violated, and when there is reason to believe that evidence of a violation may be found in a suspected offender's motor vehicle, authorized persons will request consent from the alleged violator to search the motor vehicle.

2. If consent is not given by the alleged offender, a search of the motor vehicle will be conducted only per provisions of Base Order 5820.

3007. PROCESSING OF VIOLATIONS

1. Citations will be issued when any provision of these regulations is violated. A copy will be furnished to the violator. The remaining copy will be forwarded to the PMO.

2. Military, retired military personnel, dependents, and civilians involved in serious violations of State and Federal laws will be referred to the Special Assistant U.S. Attorney (SAUSA) for disposition. Violations of any state or federal law may result in a fine issued by the CLEO. Fines levied by the CLEO will be paid within 30 days to the Central Violations Bureau (CVB). Fines not paid within 30 days will be issued a Notice to Appear in Federal Court. Failure to pay fines or appear in court on the date and time scheduled may result in summons ordering appearance or issuance of an arrest warrant.

3. A citation to appear before the Base Magistrate when issued by a CLEO will constitute a lawful order.

3008. BASE MAGISTRATE HEARINGS OFFICER

1. For the purpose of this Base Order, the Base Magistrate Hearings Officer is the administrative body responsible for carrying out the provisions of this Order per applicable regulations.

2. The Command Inspector General (IG) will provide administrative and clerical support to the Board in order to record its actions and to perform other required administrative and clerical functions.

3. The Base Magistrate Hearings Officer will establish the procedures for conducting administrative hearings to ensure that any individuals appearing will be advised of the occasion for this appearance and the basis of and administrative action which may be taken.

4. The Base Magistrate Hearings Officer will determine whether or not, and the extent to which, an alleged violation warrants administrative action. It may consider any acts or conduct wherever they may occur of any person authorized to conduct activities identified in this order. It will not be bound by any prior adjudication in its inquiry into the circumstances surrounding alleged acts or conduct that reasonably pertain to the safe operation of hunting equipment by the individual whose acts or conduct are challenged.

5. Every case will be fully and fairly adjudicated. Persons appearing will be given an opportunity to present evidence and to make such statements as may be relevant to the circumstances of the case and the disposition thereof. Counsel may appear with any person.

6. The Base Magistrate Hearings Officer may suspend or revoke any permit identified in this Order when an individual is guilty of a violation.

7. Hearings will be heard for all personnel having alleged violations which occurred on MCB Hawaii, at the Military Magistrate Office, Base Traffic Court.

3009. LOSS OF HUNTING PRIVILEGES. If the Base Magistrate Hearings Officer imposes a suspension period or revocation for violations of regulation identified or referenced in this Order, the individual immediately loses privilege identified or referenced in this Order unless, in the Board's discretion, a later period would provide a more appropriate or meaningful penalty. Suspensions or revocations imposed by civil courts are subject to

enforcement aboard MCB Hawaii. Upon any subsequent revocation by the Magistrate Hearings Officer, the individual will lose all privileges regulated or administered by the Director of Operations and Training.

3010. ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES. Violations of Base, State and Federal statutes and regulations identified or referenced in this Order occurring on MCB Hawaii will be acted upon by the Base Magistrate Hearings Officer as follows:

3011. REPORTS. The Base Magistrate Hearings Officers will forward copies of citations and reports of action to the concerned individual's Commanding Officer or employer for information and appropriate action.

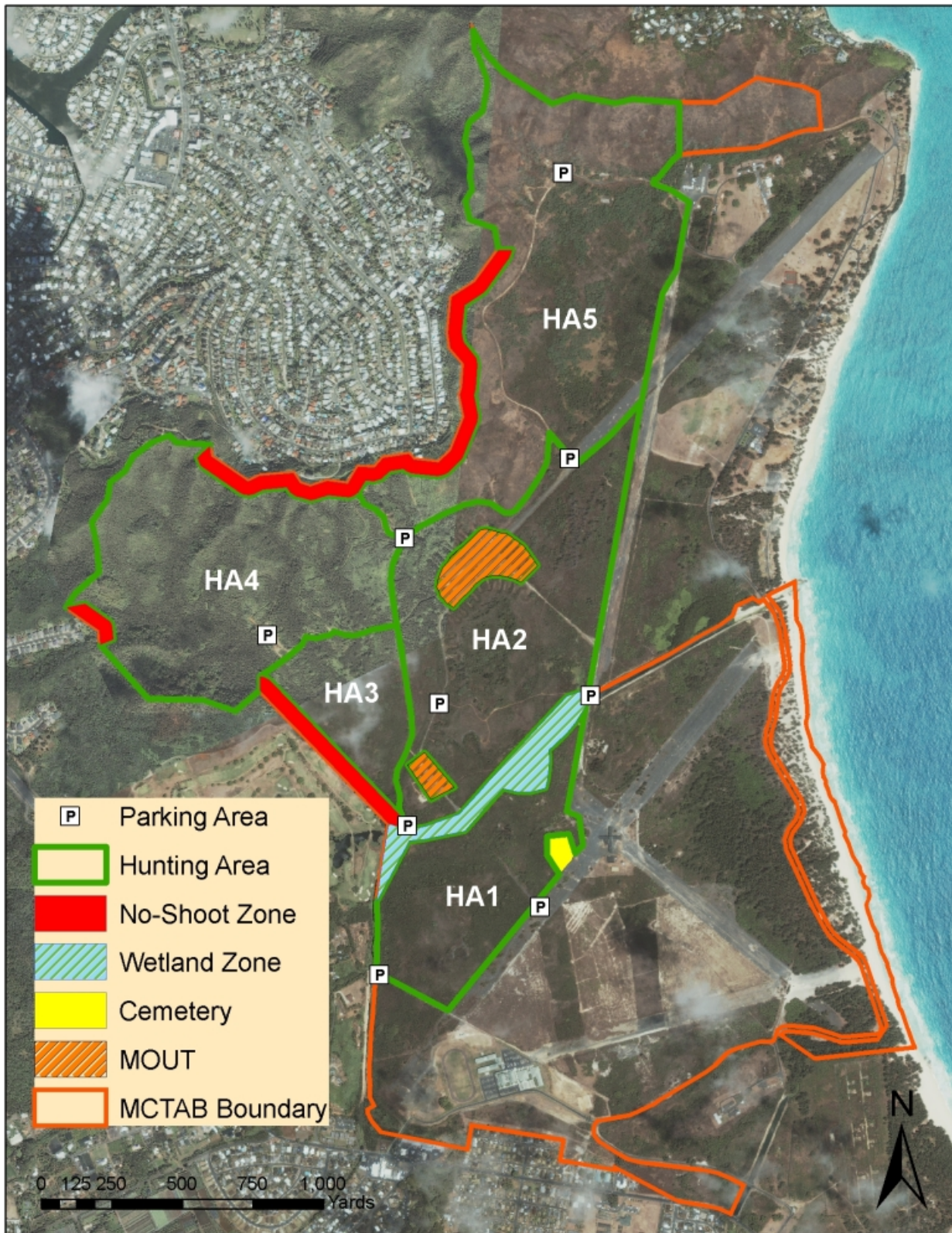
3012. RIGHTS OF APPEAL. Any person whose privileges related to this Order have been suspended or revoked has the right of appeal. When informed of suspensions or revocation, the individual will be informed of their appeal rights. Persons will forward appeal in writing (original and three copies) via the chain of command to the Command Inspector, MCB Hawaii. Appeals must be initiated within 10 working days from the date of notification of suspension or revocation action.

3013. REINSTATEMENT OF PRIVILEGES. Persons whose privileges related to this Order have been revoked through provisions of this Order may reapply in writing via chain of command to the Commanding Officer (Attention: Base Inspector), after a lapse of 12 months and at three-month intervals thereafter, if desired.

3014. VIOLATION RECORDS. The Base Magistrate Hearings Officer will make appropriate entries of action taken and forward the findings to the Director, ECPD. Violation records against individuals will remain in effect for 36 months, and will be officially filed in the CLEO Office at Building PT-3. The Base CLEO will coordinate with the Provost Marshal's Office on all reports of criminal activity.

3015. AUTHORITY OF COMMANDERS/SUPERVISORS. Action taken by the Base Magistrate Hearings Officer does not relieve commanders or supervisors of their responsibility to take administrative/disciplinary action, as appropriate, against military personnel of their command or civilian employees under their supervision who are in violation of this Order.

MCTAB Security and Key Agreement

1. BACKGROUND: Security of MCTAB is of paramount importance. Access to MCTAB by legitimate hunters is a privilege. O&T, IE&L, ECPD, and MPD have agreed to a program whereby hunter access can be accomplished by issuing keys to certain gates at MCTAB. Security must not be compromised. Therefore, any hunter granted the trust of signing out a key for personal access must agree to the following:

a. The key will not be transferred to any other person or used for any purpose except to allow access for hunting. The key will not be duplicated. Hunters entering MCTAB have a responsibility to lock the main gate after they enter and when they exit. All gates will be secured at all times. Hunters who have signed out a key may provide access for properly licensed and permitted hunters. All hunters on MCTAB whether obtaining a key or not, must sign this form acknowledging that they have been briefed on harvest reporting, area availability, buffer zones, and contact information for checking in and checking out.

b. All keys will be returned to Base Range Control immediately at the end of the hunting weekend.

c. The hunter will agree to surrender his/her hunting permit if the key is not returned as required. A key will not be reissued to those who do not check in their key.
