

Does your **Child** pass the **Seat Belt Fit Test?**

- 1** Does the vehicle lap belt fit across your child's upper thigh?
- 2** Does the shoulder belt fit across your child's shoulder and chest?
- 3** Do your child's knees bend comfortably at the edge of the auto seat when his or her back and bottom are against the vehicle seat back?
- 4** Can your child stay seated like this the whole trip?

If the answer is NO to at least one of these questions, then your child must ride in a child safety seat or booster seat.

Hawaii's law requires children under the age of four to ride in a child safety seat and children 4 through 7 years old, and under 4'9", to ride in a child safety seat or a booster seat when traveling in a motor vehicle.
